LICENSING COMMITTEE

PROCEDURAL RULES FOR THE HEARING OF LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATIONS

1 Purpose

- 1.1 These rules have been prepared to facilitate proper consideration of licence applications, made under the Licensing Act 2003, by the Licensing Committee and its Sub Committees.
- 1.2 The rules set out a framework for how applications are to be heard and explain the role of the participants at the Hearing.

2 Definitions

- 2.1 The following definitions describe the participants at and the subject matter of a Hearing:
 - "Applicant" means the person who has submitted an Application for consideration by the Committee.
 - "Applicant's Premises" means premises subject to the Application.
 - "Applicant's Representative" means a person attending a Hearing to assist or represent an Applicant including a lawyer.
 - "Application" means an application for the Grant/Variation/Transfer/Review and any other decision to be made by the Committee/Sub-Committee in respect of a Licence.
 - "Chairperson" means the Member who is the Chairperson of the Committee for the particular Hearing.
 - **"Committee"** means the Council's Licensing Committee and includes any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee.
 - "Committee Lawyer" means the Council's Lawyer (including an external Lawyer instructed by the Council's Legal & Democratic Services Manager) who is present at a Hearing to advise the Chairperson and the Members.
 - "Committee Manager" means the Council's Officer who is present at a Hearing to take minutes.
 - "Committee Report" means the Licensing Officer's written report to the Committee concerning an Application, a copy of which has been previously made available to the Applicant or their Representative, a Responsible Authority or their Representative or any person who has made a Relevant Representation or their Representative.
 - "Hearing" means a meeting of the Committee at which an Application is considered.



- "Licence" means a Licence which the Committee has the power or duty inter alia to grant, transfer, suspend or revoke.
- "Licensing Officer" means the Council's Licensing Officer(s) who is/are present at a Hearing to present reports in respect of an Application and to give technical advice in respect of an Application to the Committee when requested.
- "Licensing Authority" the Council in whose geographical area the subject matter of the Application relates to, and includes the Council's Licensing Committee, any Sub Committee of the Licensing Committee and a Licensing Officer.
- "**Member**" means a Member who is a Member of the Committee that is considering an Application.
- "Person making a Relevant Representation" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of that person including a Lawyer.
- "Responsible Authority" means a person who is present at a Hearing to make representations in respect of an Application in their capacity as Responsible Authority and includes any person who is present to assist or make representations on behalf of the Responsible Authority including a Lawyer.

3 Key Principles

- 3.1 The principles of 'natural justice', and Article 6 'Right to a Fair Trial', which is one of the Convention Rights in the Human Rights Act 1998, require that there is a fair Hearing of Applications.
- 3.2 Natural justice is an umbrella term for the legal standards of basic fairness. This will include that:
 - 3.2.1 the Applicant has an opportunity to make representations before a decision is made:
 - 3.2.2 those making representations have an opportunity to voice their representations before a decision is made;
 - 3.2.3 the Applicant has an adequate opportunity to consider and respond to any submissions made by a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation;
 - 3.2.4 the Committee does not exclude an Applicant from a Hearing in order to consider submissions from a Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation.
- 3.3 It is also fundamental that there is an orderly presentation of submissions at a Hearing so that the relevant issues are properly understood, evidence is tested and that oral statements made at the Hearing are accurately recorded.



3.4 Ultimately the Chairperson determines the application of these rules, having regard to any submissions being made by those present and in particular the Committee Lawyer.

4 The Hearing

- 4.1 The Hearing shall take place in public.
 - 4.1.1 The Committee may exclude the public from all or part of the Hearing where it considers it to be in the public interest to do so and, in accordance with the Local Government (Access to Information) Act 1985, as amended. Public includes a party and any person assisting or representing a party.
 - 4.1.2 The Committee may require any person attending the Hearing who, in its opinion, is behaving in a disruptive manner, to leave the Hearing and may:
 - A refuse to permit them to return;
 - B permit them to return only on such conditions as the Committee may specify;
 - C in the event that a person is required to leave a Hearing that person may, before the end of the Hearing, submit to the Committee in writing any information which they would have given orally.
- 4.2 Prior to the Hearing commencing, the Chairperson shall advise the parties of the procedure it proposes to follow at the Hearing.
- 4.3 Where a party has previously requested permission for a person(s), other than their representative, to appear at the Hearing then the Committee shall consider whether to permit that request.
- 4.4 The Committee will allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights.
- 4.5 This equal maximum time may have been notified in advance of the Hearing;
- 4.6 Where there are a number of people who have attended the Hearing to make the same representation then the Committee would normally require that a spokesperson be appointed by them to make the representations on behalf of all of those who have made Relevant Representations.

5 Presentation of Submissions

- 5.1 The Chairperson will introduce the Application.
- 5.2 In the event that the Licensing Authority has given notice to a party requiring clarification on a point(s) then that party shall respond to the points raised by the Licensing Authority.
- 5.3 Submissions shall be made in the following order unless the Chairperson directs otherwise:



- 5.3.1 The Licensing Officer will orally present the Committee Report and will in particular advise the Committee as to:
 - A the options available to it;
 - B the considerations that are relevant in reaching its decision.
- 5.3.2 The Applicant (or the Applicant's Representative) will orally present its submission which may include:
 - A presenting their case in accordance with the papers, which will have been circulated with Agenda papers:
 - B confirming key information and answer pertinent questions; and
 - C calling witnesses in support of the Application (see paragraph 4.3).
- 5.3.3 A Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation will orally present their representations in turn which shall include:
 - A the grounds of the representation to the Application; and
 - B any condition(s) that the Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation would be happy to have the Application granted subject to which would cause the representation to be withdrawn.

6 Questioning of Submissions

- 6.1 The Chairperson will regulate the order in which questions are asked by Members.
- 6.2 The Chairperson and Members, voiced through the Chairperson, may question any party following the completion of their submission.
- 6.3 The Chairperson will normally permit the Applicant, a Responsible Authority/Authorities or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to ask questions through them of the other parties.
- 6.4 The Chairperson may direct that questions which are not relevant to the Application or one of the four Licensing Objectives are not formally put or answered.

7 Documentation

7.1 No party shall present new documentation to the Committee at the Hearing other than with the consent of all of the other parties. This does not preclude the Licensing Officer from correcting errors, providing updated information or an extract from a local map showing the Applicant's Premises in the context of the surrounding premises and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation . If any party is granted permission to present supplementary papers at the Hearing they shall provide at least 10 copies at the start of their submission.

8 Intervention

The Chairperson shall permit the following interventions at any point in the Hearing:



- 8.1 The Committee Lawyer to advise the Committee on issues of law, procedure and relevant considerations on decision making. If necessary, the Chairperson may require the Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager to leave the Hearing so that advice can be given.
- 8.2 The Committee Manager to advise the Committee on procedure generally, or to request that statements made are repeated for reasons of clarity and so that they can be properly recorded.
- 8.3 The Licensing Officer to seek to clarify statements that have been made in light of information held on their file.

9 Failure of Parties to Attend Hearing

- 9.1 If a party has informed the Licensing Authority that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing, the Hearing may proceed in its absence.
- 9.2 If a party has not indicated that it does not intend to attend or be represented at a Hearing and fails to attend or be represented at the Hearing then the Licensing Authority may:
 - 9.2.1 where it considers it be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the Hearing to a specified date; or
 - 9.2.2 hold the Hearing in the party's absence.
- 9.3 Where the Licensing Authority holds a Hearing in the absence of a party, it shall consider at the Hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.

10 Closing Submissions

10.1 The Chairperson shall allow first, the Responsible Authority/Authorities and any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation to make a closing oral submission(s) and secondly invite the Applicant or the Applicant's Representative an opportunity to make an oral closing submission in support of the Application.

11 Decision

- 11.1 The Committee, the Committee Lawyer and the Committee Manager, shall retire so that the decision may be considered in private, and to consider any legal issues raised by the Members.
- 11.2 The decision, and brief reasons for the decision, of the Committee shall be communicated orally by the Chairperson to the parties after the Committee has deliberated in private on the Application.
- 11.3 Written reasons shall be provided soon after the deliberations of the Application and in any event within the statutory time limits.



Hearing Procedure Summary

- 1. The Democratic Services Officer will request nominations for a Chairman for the Hearing.
- 2. The Chairperson welcomes all those present and introduces the Application.
- 3. The Chairperson introduces the members of the Sub Committee and invites all parties present (Applicant, Responsible Authority/Authorities, any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation and Council Officers) to introduce themselves.
- 4. The Chairperson outlines the Hearing Procedure as set out in the Agenda, makes any relevant announcements and asks for any declarations of interest.
- 5. The Licensing Officer is asked to present their Committee Report.
- 6. The Applicant/their representative is invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their application.
- 7. Questions to the Applicant by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 8. Questions to the Applicant by Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 9. Any Responsible Authority/Authorities and/or any person/s who have made a Relevant Representation are invited to address the Sub Committee in support of their representations.
- 10. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by Members of the Sub Committee.
- 11. Questions to the Responsible Authorities/those who have made a Relevant Representation by the Applicant, which are to be directed through the Chairperson.
- 12. Closing submissions by those Parties who have made a Relevant Representation in reverse order.
- 13. Closing submissions by the Applicant.
- 14. Sub Committee retires with the Committee Lawyer and Committee Manager to consider its decision.
- 15. Sub Committee returns and the Lawyer gives a summary of any legal advice that may have been given to the Sub Committee.
- 16. The Chairperson either gives the decision with reasons, or advises that it will be released in writing with reasons within the statutory time limits (5 working days).

1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To determine an application for a Premises Licence in respect of Fig, 5 The Shambles, Bradford On Avon, BA15 1JS made by Kayra Collection LTD.

2. Background Information

- 2.1 An application for a Premises Licence in respect of Fig, 5 The Shambles, Bradford On Avon, BA15 1JS has been made by Kayra Collection LTD for which eleven relevant representations have been received.
- 2.2 Wiltshire Council (as the Licensing Authority) must hold a hearing to consider the application having regard to the representations. In accordance with Section 18 (3) of The Licensing Act 2003 the Licensing Sub Committee is required to take such of the steps listed in 2.4 below as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. In considering the application and the relevant representations, the Sub Committee must also have regard to relevant Government guidance and the Council's Licensing Policy

2.3 The licensing objectives are:

- i) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder;
- ii) Public Safety;
- iii) The Prevention of Public Nuisance; and
- iv) The Protection of Children from Harm.

2.4 Such steps are:

- i) To grant the licence subject to such conditions as are consistent with those included in the operating schedule submitted with the application, modified to such extent as the Sub Committee considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives, together with any mandatory conditions required by the Licensing Act.
- ii) To exclude from the scope of the application any licensable activity.
- iii) To refuse to specify a person as the designated premises supervisor.
- iv) To reject the application.

- 2.5 On 26 July 2024 an application for a new premise licence was received and accepted as a valid application.
- 2.6 The application as applied for is as follows:

3. Consultation and Representations

3.1 The application process requires the application to be advertised, by the Applicant, in a local news publication within 10 working days, starting on the day after the authority receives it and for a public notice (on pale blue paper)

to be posted on the premises. In addition, the Licensing Authority advertises the application on its website, for a period of 28 consecutive days, starting the day after the authority receives the application.

- 3.2 Consultation was extended by a period of eleven days due to a delay in the Blue Notice being displayed. This was displayed on 7 August 2024
- 3.3 During the consultation period eleven relevant representations have been received from local residents and two letters of support received.

- 3.7 The relevant representations are attached as **Appendix 3A K.** The letters of support are attached as **Appendix 4.**
- 3.8 During the consultation period the applicant submitted a response to the objectors, this was shared with all parties. This is shown as **Appendix 5.**

4. Legal Implications

- 4.1 This hearing is governed by the Licensing Act 2003 (Hearings) Regulations. These provide that hearings should be held in public unless the Licensing Authority considers that the public interest in excluding the public outweighs the public interest in the hearing taking place in public.
- 4.2 The Applicant, and all persons who have made representations have been informed of the date, time and location of the hearing and their right to attend and be represented.
- 4.3 At the hearing all those who have made representations are entitled to address the Sub Committee and to ask questions of another party, with the consent of the Sub Committee.

5. Officer Recommendations

5.1 Officers are not permitted to make a recommendation – the decision is to be reached by the members of the Licensing Sub Committee.

6. Right of Appeal

- 6.1 It should be noted that the Applicant and those persons who have made representations may appeal the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee to the Magistrates Court. The appeal must be lodged with the Magistrates Court within 21 days of the notification of the decision.
- 6.2 In the event of an appeal being lodged, the decision made by the Licensing Sub Committee remains valid until any appeal is heard and any decision made by the Magistrates Court.
- 6.3 A Responsible Authority or any person may apply to the Licensing Authority for a Review of a Premises Licence. Whether or not a Review Hearing takes place is in the discretion of the Licensing Authority, but, if requested by a person other than a Responsible Authority it will not normally be granted within the first 12 months except for the most compelling circumstances.







Children's safety - no concern

<u>Public nuisance</u> - any outside gatherings cause noise, adding consumption of alcohol increases the volume.

Mainly for this reason, we consider this site is unsuitable for any outside licensed catering after normal shop trading hours.

In this area of Coppice Hill this would almost certainly cause noise nuisance to much of this narrow residential street.

Many residents are elderly, some live alone, and for years enjoyed a peaceful retreat in the town centre.

The more recent development of holiday lets will be affected by evening noise, however well mannered the customers. Those premises and their occupants will be exposed to noise, as many of their windows (often single glazed) are very close to the site.

<u>Crime & Disorder</u> - No serious concerns anticipated

<u>Public Safety</u> - Coppice Hill is narrow & will be easily affected by any extra pedestrian activity as there is no continuous pavement.

Suggested Action -



I wish to make the following comments regarding the above License application

Historical

Coppice Hill is a narrow 17th century street. Having resided here since 1971, I am very familiar with the problems arising from licenced premises affecting all residents of the street. From the former Kings Arms, immediately opposite this application premises, we have endured an infringement on our privacy and peace with excessive noise, drunken abuse, urination on the street and vehicles, and even customers laying in the street blocking vehicular access (I have much correspondence confirming this). I would not wish this to ever happen again. What measures would the applicant take to prevent a re-occurrence of this situation should an alcohol licence be awarded?

The prevention of public nuisance

The centre of Bradford on Avon is unique in that it acts as an amphitheatre. All noises and conversations at the bottom of Coppice Hill funnel up its entire length sounding even louder at the top and are clearly heard at all properties on it. This is exacerbated by the fact that most properties are listed and part of a conservation area, having single glazed windows.

On Monday night an external alarm went off at the application premises. Three residents went out separately in their nightclothes to ascertain from where the noise was emanating. One new resident commented that it sounded even louder at the top of Coppice Hill than at the actual premises! The applicant is quoting a maximum capacity of 93 customers at any one time. With windows open and an outside patio area on Coppice Hill, any noise or conversations would be unbearable to all residents at the proposed prolonged hours. No amount of insulation will stop noise from funnelling through the tall buildings up Coppice Hill.

Application alcohol licence is for 8 am 'til 11 pm. I consider this to be both too early a start and too late a finish for alcohol consumption in a property so close to affected residents.

The applicants floor plans show only one toilet on the first floor. Can this be sufficient for a capacity of 93 customers at any one time, or will we as residents, be subjected to urination in the street once again?

Additionally, the floor plan shows outside seating for up to 16 in the Shambles. How can these be accommodated without blocking the Shambles? Additionally, this should be restricted to the normal opening hours of the other Shambles shops.

Public safety

The floor plans illustrate additional customer access and egress via a side access gate in Coppice Hill, next to an outside seating area (capacity 9). Coppice Hill is very narrow at this point, with no pavement on this side. In my 53 years' residency this gate has never been used other than for a few deliveries. This poses a safety hazard to anyone using it from the large number of vehicles continually accessing Coppice Hill. Additionally, what is to stop customers from standing in the street to drink and smoke?

Before I move on to my specific Representation, may I draw attention to the plans submitted in support of the Application for a Licence. With reference to the Ground Floor Plan, there is no reference to the Greengrocer currently on the corner of Coppice Hill and the Shambles and it appears as though that premises has been subsumed into No 5 The Shambles.

Public Safety

The plan includes an entry/exit off Coppice Hill, also to be used as a Fire Exit. This leads directly onto the Hill at a point where there is no pavement on the Shambles side of the road, and a very narrow pavement opposite. This would be very dangerous in the event of having to evacuate all customers through this door because of a fire elsewhere in the premises.

In the last 2 years there has been a sharp increase in the volume of traffic up and down the Hill because of deliveries by online suppliers of groceries and other goods. In addition, quite often residents are held up at the foot of Coppice Hill because of deliveries to the Shambles and Silver Street. Customers going in and out of the cafe/shop by this door would add to the problems.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

What provision is being made for the additional rubbish removal for a licensed cafe/shop which would seat more than 80 people at any one time? There have already been rats in the alleys off Coppice Hill, there is additional rubbish being collected from the Coppice Hill end of the Shambles and the rubbish bin at the Coppice end of the Shambles often overflows.

The granting of a Licence for Alcohol for 7 days a week from 8.00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m. with outside seating is likely to cause excess disturbance to local residents, particularly the proposed patio area on Coppice Hill. This area is presumably particularly attractive for smokers and vapers, and will probably attract more customers standing in the street. Noise already rises up the hill, illustrated by the building's alarm going off during the night earlier this week and three of us wandering out to see whether there was indeed a fire or burglary. Because this is a conservation area, even modest buildings are listed and there

is no chance of mitigating the noise by doubleglazing windows.

The Shambles is a pedestrian area and while it is very welcome and attractive to see people sitting outside in good weather, it is becoming increasingly difficult for families with pushchairs and, frankly, even local residents to walk through particularly at lunchtime. It would be impossible for disability scooters.

I notice that seating for 16 people in the Shambles itself spreads over the current Greengrocers' frontage. This would appear to make it impossible for him to display his wares or for customers to be served by him. Seating for an extra 16 people in the Shambles would also make walking through and access to other shops much more difficult. I do not think this is in the public interest.

The prevention of public The Licence makes no provision to 'Condition' the evening consumption nuisance of 'on-sales' and 'off-sales' alcohol at the proposed frontage external tables + seating (16 covers) and contiguous 'standing only' (19ppl) patio area of the Premises. - The need for a Condition is particularly applicable in this area where there is residential accommodation in the immediate proximity of the premises – and which, itself, is located in a 'narrow street canvon' of listed buildings in a Conservation Area where noise is considerably echoed and amplified. Prior to the closure of The Bear Public House (50 metres away), the local area had suffered a great deal of anti-social behaviour that resulted from consumption of alcohol outside, within the courtyard and nearby to the premises. The anti-social behaviour was having an adverse effect upon nearby residents due to increased level of noise, disturbance and littering. Communal and secluded areas (courtyard entrances, alley ways and doorways) were being used as a gathering point for people to drink, deal, urinate and engage in noisy anti-social behaviour. Serious concerns regarding the Application in its present form are raised as to how a Licence to feature external seating would not contribute to ASB in the area. Consideration should be given to the potential steps which could be taken to reduce the risk of external noise nuisance occurring after 8pm.

This would involve the closure of the outside frontage area seating/tables by 8pm. These would necessitate alcohol consumption and dining to be entertained within the Premises, internally, only.

I am a resident in the locale.

I would like to make representation to suggest modifications to the proposed operating plan - in short, to make recommendation for Conditions to be attached to the Licence to make the Application acceptable in the eyes of local residents.

Whilst the Premises deserves commercial success, local resident experience has shown that some of the proposed aspects of the premises are at issue - and consideration for the residential dwellings adjacent and within the immediate locale has been overlooked.

At that location – fundamentally a 'narrow street canyon' – and one profoundly subject to sound reflection from the building facades which echo with unwanted sound - it is difficult to envisage external (evening) hospitality being provided without the neighbouring residential dwellings experiencing some impact - and it is appropriate that the licensing authority take steps and apply Conditions (e.g. pavement licence and conditions prohibiting use after 8pm) to prevent public nuisance from occurring.

I write in support of the above application which I believe will add to the diversity of eating and drinking options in Bradford on Avon. The opportunity to purchase deli items will be welcomed as will a wine bar to contrast with public houses. There is no other business here offering this combination.

Over recent years the central Deli and Wine Bar have closed and they are very much missed. Their location was a few yards away from the Shambles. This new business will be covering aspects of both businesses and I believe this meets the needs of the town's residents and visitors and will be a successful, viable, business, run by people with the appropriate skills to ensure that public nuisance potential is eliminated.

PUBLIC SAFETY

I believe that there is a positive impact to having a business open in the Shambles in the evenings. When I walk home at night I sometimes walk down the main road to ensure there are others/vehicles around, instead of going through the Shambles which is generally empty on the evenings. Having people present there would make me feel safer going through the Shambles.

I am told that it is NOT the intention to have the business open EVERY night but that the licence to cover every day is required in order to be able to open for special events on requested days.

The neighbouring businesses which have alcohol licences (DandyLion, Stumble Inn, Pablo's and Bunch of Grapes) have far more residential accommodation nearby and in closer proximity and these do not seem to present public nuisance problems. In addition, loud and late events held in Lambs Yard are permitted. A possible mitigation may be to close one evening a week eg Sunday. In a tourist town, bringing considerable sums of money into the area, we need a variety of options for eating and drinking and this business is clearly a different and attractive idea.

Having a vacant premise on the main shopping area in town, as is now the case, is detrimental to the appeal to tourists.

A local person, already contributing greatly to catering for visitors and residents, in their current business near the Tithe Barn, who wants to bring more employment opportunities, having returned to her home town, should not be discouraged from attempting to meet a local need.

Good afternoon Emma.

Thank you for sending over the valid representation for us to address any concerns.

Please find our response to this below. The blue notice has also been updated this morning and replaced in the window.

Thank you for notifying us of your concerns regarding the application of a premises licence. The capacity has been calculated at the premises by square footage.

Current health and safety guidelines is 2 to 4 people by square footage. Bearing in mind the property is over two floors. We are happy to reduce the capacity to 75 at one time. This number is more than adequate reference to square footage of the property.

We are aware that the side patio gate is leading to Coppice Hill and there is no footpath on our side. The footpath is located opposite. This road is currently in use on foot by families with prams and residents who live on Coppice Hill and they are using this road on a daily basis to commute to their houses. There are also a couple of self catering accommodations on Coppice Hill with families and people renting these accommodations who are using this area also. There is already a high volume of visitors walking up and down this road on daily basis as it is a historical attraction. Having been a resident on Coppice Hill for a few years I am aware that this is a no through road accessed by residents and delivery drivers so traffic is minimal. However we are fully aware of any health and safety issues regarding this. The outside patio area has been designed to allow for a maximum of 9 covers in this area only with bar style seating up against the wall to mitigate any problems of people sitting on the wall. The seating faces onto the road against the wall with bar style stools. So customers would sit side by side. We have installed trellis at the side in order to grow planting to help create a sound barrier. Small long planters are to be attached to the top of the wall to stop anyone from sitting there whilst creating an inviting space to be in. Clear signage will be displayed on the gate notifying customers of the danger an example of that is attached below. A child safety latch will be installed on the gate also. The side access will not be the main access route. Customers will be encouraged to use the front entrance into the premises using signage on the front of the gate (Please use entrance located on The shambles).

The operating hours on the patio area will be during sociable hours only and customers will be expected to be seated whether inside or outside whilst using the premises. We are not operating a bar where customers can freely wander around drinking. This is a cafe, deli and shop open into the evening where table service is required.

We are always welcome to improving our health and safety measures, because as a company we strongly believe in safety first and have great respect for our neighbours and residents of this area as we hope to be able to provide a service that they will enjoy and benefit from.

I hope all these additional informations and adjustments will give assurance to yourself and objector that as a company we are taking health and safety seriously.

We thank you for taking the time to raise these concerns and hope this will help alleviate any worries you may have. If you would like to speak to us in person we would be happy to arrange to do this.
