

Gypsy and Traveller Site Consultation

Consultation planned on possible new Gypsy and Traveller sites following on from the work carried out in April and June this year has now been put on hold. The issues consultation used figures proposed in the draft South West Regional Spatial Strategy as the basis of future need for Gypsy and Traveller sites. The Regional Spatial Strategy has now been revoked and it falls to local authorities to determine the right level of site provision. Officers are currently assessing existing information about the level of need for new Gypsy and Traveller sites in Wiltshire to make sure the development plan document progresses with the correct local targets for new site provision. This has affected the overall timetable for the preparation of the Gypsy and Traveller Site Allocations document. The Area Board will be informed once a revised project timetable on the provision of new sites for the travelling community is available.

Wiltshire Council has a duty under the Flood and Water Management Act to establish, quantify and record the levels of flooding within the county following on from the Pitt review and recent major flooding events. As a lead authority, Wiltshire Council can ask other bodies within the county to provide relevant information in order to allow the discharge of duty. This duty is on both lead and local authorities, which includes town and parish councils.

Wiltshire Council is beginning to get enough data to start making statistical comparisons, for example the number of parishes who have reported internal property flooding, have flood supplies and are on the Environment Agency warning telephone list. This is providing information on where in the county Wiltshire Council might like to prioritise storing flood supply equipment, or where the parish have identified issues with blocked culverts/drains enabling us to investigate the current schedules.

The information Wiltshire Council has received to date has been on the whole very good, it has been loaded onto the GIS system and the overlay is taking shape and is very informative.

If issues are subsequently raised at Area Board level by the parishes who have not responded, this will impact the time taken for their work to be undertaken and it will impact on any planning issues, as access to this information is very important. This work will benefit the parishes as well as county.

 - o promote equality of opportunity
 - o improve quality of life and promote a healthy natural environment
- A shorter-term implementation plan based on a realistic assessment of available funding, and
- A number of supporting strategies and technical documents.

In addition, the Local Transport Plan provides the framework for all other organisations with a direct or indirect involvement in transport in Wiltshire.

Consultation on the draft Local Transport Plan will run from **4 October to 26 November 2010**.

Paper copies of the summary document, questionnaire and a reference copy of the Local Transport Plan will also be available from all libraries and main Council offices.

	The Chairman invited people to note the consultation papers attached to the agenda and advised them that due to the postponement of the regional spatial planning document, an extraordinary meeting may be scheduled to discuss the proposed approach to reviewing housing requirements for the draft South Wiltshire Core Strategy since the Regional Spatial Strategy was revoked on 6th July.	
	Note: Subsequently, this meeting would not now take place because officers felt that the consultation that had already been undertaken on the South Wiltshire Core Strategy to date had given the Council a good understanding of the views locally regarding housing growth in the Community Areas of South Wiltshire and this information would be used to inform the review. An update would be provided at the next Board meeting on 14th October 2010.

	The minutes of the previous meeting on 17 June 2010 were approved and signed as a correct record by the Chairman.	
6.	Neighbourhood Policing Team Update	
	The Board received an update from the Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT), to raise awareness of the Neighbourhood Tasking	

Groups (NTG) as a mechanism for communicating with the police about crime and disorder in the community. The NTG was a forum whereby the Community Beat Manager could liaise with local representatives to discuss local priorities. These priorities were then monitored over the period between meetings and action, where possible, could be taken to address the priority. Sergeant Dean Garvin, Community Beat Manager Henry Clissold and PCSO Kim Weston gave an introduction to the role of the teams and explained how issues could be brought to the NPT and the various methods in which those issues were then dealt with. Every three months the officers would meet to discuss the issues recently brought to their attention, details of those requiring further investigation would be passed on to the Neighbourhood Task Force (NTF), so that the best officer for the job could be matched to each issue. The unit would bid for funds on a forthightly basis, for resources to carry out further investigation in to chosen issues. 7. Update on Parish Plans and the role of the Area Board The Chairman reminded the Board that some time ago, Winterslow Parish Plan Steering Group had presented a copy of their Parish Plan for the Board to respond with their views. He went on to explain that at present no formal process for the endorsement of Parish Plans or Village Design Statements was in place, as had been carried out by an officer of Salisbury District Council. 

	Chris Moore, Reading and Learning Services Manager explained that the Library Service was currently undergoing a four stage review ending in September 2010, to establish ideas for future library services, what could potentially be on offer and how £500,000 of savings could be achieved within the next two years.	
	Chris gave a presentation to the Board and asked people to complete a card that had been circulated, for people to comment on what their top five priorities for the Library Service for the future would be.	
	Councillor lan McLennan spoke about the importance of libraries in our communities, as it seemed the more educated people became, the less they thought about libraries. However, people from the least able backgrounds struggle to purchase anything, including books and would be at a disadvantage if they did not have access to a local library service.	
10.	Waste Consultation	
	Tracy Carter, Service Director for Waste Management Services gave a presentation and explained that the Council aimed to engage as many communities as possible in the consultation and went on to explain why there was a need for change.	
	Following the formation of a unitary council, Wiltshire Council currently operated several different waste collection services across the county. It was felt that every resident of Wiltshire deserved the same service and the same opportunities for recycling, no matter where they lived in the county.	
	The proposed new service would be:	
	• To maintain the existing black box recycling collection and the

ALLOCATION OF ADDITIONAL GRIT BINS IN SOUTHERN WILTSHIRE COMMUNITY AREA

<u>Summary</u>

This report deals with the allocation of additional grit bins in our community area. There are 5 additional grit bins to allocate across the area this represents an increase of 10% in our area. Requests from parish councils were sought earlier in the year which totalled 20 in Southern Wiltshire made by 6 different parish councils. The Community Area Manager has written to the 6 parish councils to ask them to prioritise their requests however it appears that the fairest way to distribute the grit bins is by allocating one to each parish, with the exception of Downton Parish Council who have kindly informed me that one of their requests had in fact been installed during this year. Please see appendix 1 which sets out the 20 requests.

<u>Proposal</u>

That, as Downton PC received one of their requested bins earlier this year, the board allocates 1 bin each to the parishes of:

COOMBE BISSETT, FIRSDOWN, LANDFORD, LAVERSTOCK & PITTON & FARLEY

The parish councils above are required to confirm their preferred location to Tom Bray by 28 October 2010.

Reasons For Proposal

This proposal implements Wiltshire Council's additional grit bin allocation whereby the Southern Wiltshire Area Board were allocated 5 bins to distribute throughout the community area.

1. To approve the release of the remaining developer's contribution to Laverstock Parish Council for land adopted and the provision of sports recreation facilities which are maintained at the expense of Laverstock Parish Council.

Background

- 2. Laverstock Parish Council adopted amenity land and play equipment on the development known as 'Land off Duck Lane, Laverstock and provides sports recreation facilities for the development. The Parish Council are now responsible for the perpetual maintenance of the facilities and amenity land.
- 3. In accordance with the Section 106 Agreement drawn up under the Town and Country Planning Act the then Salisbury District Council received a contribution from the developer towards this future maintenance and provision of the sports recreation facilities.
- 4. The remaining contribution consists of £41,258.78.
- 5. Laverstock Parish Council at present applies to Wiltshire Council for funds to carry out routine maintenance and providing the sports recreation facilities.

This proposal supports and implements Wiltshire Council's Reducing Unnessessary Lighting Project whereby the Southern Wiltshire Area Board were allocated £5000 to distribute throughout the community area where there was interest.

Progress Report

As there are Parish Councils who are still interested in this project I have given them until 12 November to get their submissions to me. All submissions received by that date will be passed to Highways to carry out the technical assessment in time for the funds to be allocated at the area board on 3 February 2011. If members approve the funding for Firsdown and Landford there will be £3,360 which is the equivalent of 84 street light units.

Recommendation

To approve the assessed proposals totalling £1640 which equates to 38 streetlights in Firsdown (of 52 streetlights submitted) and 3 in Landford (of 3 streetlights submitted). Map of Firsdown's lights at appendix 1 (attached).

1. Wiltshire Voices – £56,000 for the county-wide project (£3,000 for area based work)

1. Background

- 1.1. Area Boards have authority to approve Area Grants under powers delegated to them by the Deputy Leader and Cabinet member for Community Services (27 February 2010). Under the Scheme of Delegation Area Boards must adhere to the Area Board Grants Guidance for funding.
- 1.2. In accordance with the Scheme of Delegation, any recommendation of an Area Board that is contrary to the funding criteria would need the approval of the Leader, the appropriate Cabinet Member or the Cabinet.
- 1.3. In accordance with the Area Board Grants Guidance officers are required to provide recommendations in their report, however, the decision to support applications and to what level is made by Wiltshire Councillors on this Area Board.
- 1.4. We can signpost groups to the Charities Information Bureau (CIB) for support to seek funding from elsewhere. CIB work on behalf of Wiltshire Council to support community and voluntary groups, town and parish councils to seek funding for community projects and schemes both from the Area Board and other local and national funding sources.
- 1.5. Funding applications will be considered at every Area Board meeting.
- 1.6. Southern Wiltshire Area Board has been allocated a 2010/2011 budget of £41,087 for community grants, community partnership core funding and councillor led initiatives. The carry forward from the 2009/2010 budget is £628. This leaves a total budget of £41,715 for the 2010/2011 budget. The amount spent so far this year is £22,326 leaving £18,761 up to March 2011.
- 1.7. A decision has been made that in 2010/2011and thereafter paper copies of funding applications will no longer appear as part of the agenda in an attempt to reduce volume of paper used. However, the application forms will be available on the Wiltshire Council web site and hard copies available upon request.
- 1.8. The 2010/2011 funding criteria and application forms are available on the council's website (<u>www.wiltshire.gov.uk/areaboards</u>) or paper versions are available from the Community Area Manager.

What is Wiltshire Voices?

Wiltshire Voices is a project to encourage broader participation in civic life. It is designed to ensure that the needs of all local people are properly understood and addressed.

Background

A recent review of the Area Boards revealed concern that some sections of the community are not fully engaged. These groups are often absent from meetings and events and their needs are not well understood. The Boards were criticised for focusing too heavily on the needs of the 'usual suspects.'

Responding to the challenge

Wiltshire Council's Cabinet considered this issue carefully. It has challenged the Area Boards to respond positively at local level. The Cabinet encouraged the submission of a funding bid to support this work and the Performance Reward Grant (PRG) Panel has given 'in-principle' support subject to approval by the Boards.

A focus on positive local action

Wiltshire Voices is about changing lives – not glossy reports. We want information in the form of personal stories, articles and recordings that will challenge, question and prompt responses. The information will be tailored to meet the needs of different people – such as service professionals, community groups, schools, parish councils and the media. The aim is to generate discussion, learning, ideas and - most importantly - *action.*

A lasting legacy

Wiltshire Voices is about making a lasting

difference. New ways of involving people will be developed and this will become the way we do business not an optional add-on. With help from localised public services, communities will be finding and delivering solutions to local challenges and issues. Grants and funding will be better targeted to support projects that really make a difference. Priorities and plans will be more clearly focused on the needs of local people and our work will centre around improving lives not services. Over time these things will help make Wiltshire a better place for everyone.

Capacity and resources to deliver

Instead of each Board trying to engage many groups it is proposed that each Board works intensively with one priority group in its locality. Across Wiltshire this will mean that the needs of 18 different community groups will be addressed. The bid proposes that each Board is allocated a sum of £3,000 to complete its own local project. The work will be coordinated by the Community Area Manager and involve councillors, service providers and community groups – *but most importantly local people*. Each project will take around 8 months and Wiltshire Voices will be complete by Summer 2012 at the latest.

To enable Wiltshire Voices to proceed, the Area Board is asked to support this bid for PRG funding.

- What? To make sure a wider range voices are heard by:
 - engaging a broader cross section of the community in the work of the Area Boards 'not just the usual suspects.'
 - ensuring that the loudest voices do not always dominate
 - better understanding the needs of those who cannot or do not speak up for themselves
 - creating new ways for people to participate
 - encouraging more community based inclusion projects
 - developing community plans that focus on the needs of the whole community
- Why? A survey conducted in Spring 2010 revealed serious concerns about the lack of involvement of 'everyday people' and harder to reach groups. In response, Wiltshire Council issued a challenge to the Area Boards to broaden community engagement.

Who?

- The project will focus on and involve those whose needs are less well understood.
- The 18 Community Area Mangers will facilitate the work across Wiltshire
- Partner agencies, frontline service officers, support workers, carers, voluntary services and councillors will be involved
- A small project team will lead the work in each area.

How? • Project team of key people to plan and manage the project

- Desk research and information gathering
- Face to face engagement with target group
- Recording, documenting and presenting
- Publishing and promoting
- Action planning

When? Commencing in Autumn 2010 and concluding by early Summer 2012
