1. 13/05/10 Taken from Chippenham Town Centre Patrol occurrence 54100026800

Chicoland appeared to be closing, however at 0330hrs, the doors were locked but customers were still inside waiting for their orders to be prepared.

2. 21/05/10 Police intelligence report 54100040799

Chicoland has been shutting the doors and turning off the lights at 3am as per the licence, if police are seen in the area. If the doors are shut customers often remain inside and are served though no further customers are let in. On 25/04/2010 on 2 occasions friends of customers already inside the premises were seen to place new orders after 3am by either shouting to people inside or phoning them. This has also been seen on previous occasions though dates are unknown.

3.. 29/05/10 Taken from Chippenham Town Centre Patrol occurrence 54100026800

Disorder outside Chicoland involving drunk individuals early hours of Saturday

4. 04/06/10 Police occurrence 54100044801, log POL-20100604-0047 timed 0236hrs

Having gone to Chicoland at approximately 0215hrs, a male and female were assaulted by two males. The male was dragged out of Chicoland whilst being violently assaulted. He was punched, kicked and stamped on. He lost consciousness. The female was also punched in the assault.

5. 08/06/10 Police intelligence report 54100046069

At 1300 hours on 04/06/2010, a Police Officer attended Chicoland to request a copy of CCTV from that morning. There was a single member of staff present, Mr Fazal 'Alex' FAIZ. FAIZ refused to give his date of birth. After denying seeing or being aware of any incident in his store. Mr Faiz then said Police didn't need his CCTV as the incident happened outside the store.

6. 25/06/10 Police occurrence 54100051371, POL-20100625-0018 timed 0046hrs

Two males were found urinating inside the premise. One was given a Fixed Penalty Notice for being Drunk & Disorderly and one a Fixed Penalty Notice for urinating in a public place.

7. 27/06/10 Police intelligence report 54100052085

At 0255 hours on Sunday 27th June 2010 Police Officers saw staff allowing people entry into the shop. Staff inside the shop, who were aware of officers' presence, called officers over and complained that they could not shut on time as customers were refusing to leave.

8. 10/07/10 Taken from Chippenham Town Centre patrol occurrence 54100026800

Chicoland doors were open after 0300hrs.

9. 11/07/10 Police occurrence 54100057660, log POL-20100714-0165

Unknown offender(s) stole the victim's mobile phone by removing it from the front right pocket of the victim's jeans whilst he was stood queuing to purchase a takeaway or immediately afterwards when outside the takeaway shop.

10. 26/07/10 Police intelligence report 54100061544

Whilst on patrol it was noticed that Chicoland was serving past 03.00 hours. It wasn't until the Police vehicle was parked directly outside of the shops that the doors were locked. However, there were still members of the public on the premises and although they locked the door as soon as the Police vehicle parked up outside they continued to serve customers. The premise wasn't completely empty until 03.30 hours.

11. 31/07/10 Taken from Chippenham Town Centre patrol occurrence 54100026800, log POL-20100731-0059 timed 01.34hrs

A report was made of two females fighting inside Chicoland. Police attended.

12. 10/09/10 Taken from Chippenham Town Centre patrol occurrence 54100026800, log POL-20100910-0038 timed 0252hrs

A report was made of two persons fighting outside Chicoland. Police attended.

13. 15/09/10 Police intelligence report 54100077428

Police attended Chicoland in Chippenham to view footage of a disorder that may have taken place in the shop. Whilst viewing the footage in the company of the Manager it was established that their CCTV system runs an hour behind. The actual time the alleged incident took place was 0250hrs and the footage clearly showed that there were a lot of people coming in and out of the shop at that time. People were still being served and food was being cooked. There was no sign of the shop closing or staff making people aware that they were about to close. When the Police Officer confirmed that the footage was of 0250hrs the manager appeared to become agitated and then changed the subject. The Manager then fast forwarded the footage to approximately 0302hrs and the footage still showed people being served and the shop still open.

14. 12/09/10 Police Intelligence report 541008116

At 03.05 I attended Chicoland Chippenham in company Pc Lloyd, there were two males in the shop still being served with hot food. I went into the shop which was locked, once inside I saw at least one young male who was at the counter who was being served hot food.

15. 19/09/10 Police intelligence report 54100078609

Police met with Mr Faiz to discuss the concerns and suggest solutions to the problems, the following proposals were made -

- a) Voluntarily closing his premises at 0300 with no serving from 0230hrs
- b) Employing door staff in the final hours of trading
- c) Improvements to the CCTV at the premises

| Mr Faiz declined to a) and b) but gave an undertaking to ensure that the CCTV was in full working order. |
