^{e)} Page 8	4628 Whistly Lane, Potterne Concerns re: HGV Contravening existing weight limits.	HGV using the road against the weight restriction to by-pass Devizes. Large vehicles are using the single track road and finding it impossible to negotiate the tight corners. They then have to reverse considerable distances to find a place large enough for them to turn around and rejoin the A361. Contravention of the existing weight limit is an offence that can only be enforced by the Police. The limit is correctly signed and remains	
f)	4652 Sandleaze, Worton Request for 'H' Bar	appropriate. From a Highway perepective, no action possible to ensure compliance is adhered too. Parking on the road in a cul de sac in Worton is restricting the movement of buses and bin lorries such that they are mounting the kerb and making ruts in the grass. Worton Parish Council suggest restricting parking in the area slightly using an H bar line. In order to create enough room for the bin lorries and buses to turn without mounting the kerb.
