Time for a 20mph Speed Limit?

High traffic speeds increase the risk of serious injury



Why are we considering 20mph?

Bradford on Avon's streets are shared by many people and types of transport. We want to make our streets more pleasant for all. Since 2014 the Town Council has been working with Wiltshire Council gathering data from vehicle speed and volume measurements and taking account of school travel plans. 20mph should not be looked at in isolation but as one part of a plan that dove tails together with other measures to make a difference for our residents.

What is proposed?

Wiltshire Council is proposing 20mph speed limits on the roads surrounding the town's schools, sports areas, tourist areas and roads used as shortcuts for two schemes, one in the North and one in the South of Bradford on Avon.


Why aren't other roads included?

The Town Council is aware of other issues, for example on Trowbridge Road, Winsley Road, Bath Road and Ashley Road amongst others. These issues include mounting pavements and inappropriate speeding. Consideration of other measures for these areas are currently underway.

What are the next steps?

- Wiltshire Council will be consulting on this shortly with a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) (During this period details can be found at www.wiltshire.gov.uk/troconsultations.htm)

- If approved we have been awarded a substantive grant from Wiltshire Council for the proposed schemes to be implemented in Summer 2017.
