A	There is nowhere for visitors to park with the proposed restrictions  With only one off road parking space it means that any visitors to my property will have nowhere to park, even directly outside the entrance.	1	The proposed extensions of waiting restrictions in Avon Road have been developed to ensure the passage and repassage of vehicles using the road. Wiltshire Council has no obligation to provide parking on the highway.  It is considered that the extent of restrictions could be reduced by 5 metres to allow for on road parking whilst still removing the pinch point that is currently experienced in Avon Road.  The amended plan can be found in <b>Appendix 3</b> .
В	Reduce proposal to allow parking within the street  My suggestion would be to reduce the proposed No waiting at any time from 29 meters to somewhere between 9 and 13 metres. This would allow larger vehicles to negotiate the tight spot on the bend.	1	Reducing the proposed waiting restriction down to 9 or 13 metres will still result in vehicles parking on the corner of Avon Road and causing an obstruction.  The proposed restriction can be reduced by 5 metres to allow for an element of on road parking whilst still improving the obstruction in the road.  The amended plan can be found in <b>Appendix 3.</b>
