National Highways and Transport Survey

Comparison with South West Counties based on 2017 Results

The National Highways and Transport Public Satisfaction Survey is carried out by Ipos MORI for the National Highways and Transport Network of local authorities across England. The results are used to understand what people in the area think about these important services.

The satisfaction with some key service areas in Wiltshire has been compared to other counties in the south west. Results were compared with the 2017 results for Gloucestershire, Somerset, Dorset, Devon, Hampshire and Cornwall.

Satisfaction in Wiltshire was close (within 3%) to average for the south west counties for:

- Condition of pavements.
- Provision of safe crossing points.
- Dropped kerb crossing points.
- Helplines to find out more about roadworks.
- Speed of street lighting repairs.
- Weed killing on pavements and roads.
- Keeping drains clear and working.
- Undertakes cold weather gritting.

Satisfaction in Wiltshire was below the south west average for:

- Condition of road markings.
- Speed of repair to damaged roads and pavements.
- Quality of repair to damaged roads and pavements.
- Deals with potholes and damaged roads.
- Conditions of highways
