SCHOOL TERM AND HOLIDAYS 2019/20

1. <u>Purpose of Report</u>

The purpose of this report is to ask the cabinet member to agree the school term and holiday dates for 2019/20 for Wiltshire's Community, Voluntary Controlled and Community Special Schools.

2. <u>Relevance to the Council's Business Plan</u>

Not applicable.

3. <u>Main Considerations for the Council</u>

In order to fulfil our statutory duties under Section 32 of the Education Act 2002, the local authority is responsible for determining the term dates for all community, voluntary controlled or community special schools in Wiltshire.

4. <u>Background</u>

A protocol for the setting of school term and holiday dates has been endorsed by the Teachers Joint Consultative Committee and County Secretaries.

The South West Officers Group, made up of officers from neighbouring Local Authorities, co-ordinate several times a year to facilitate consultation to ensure that we propose similar, if not the same, dates.

All proposed term dates are sent out for consultation to our Teachers, School Governors, Members, Parents and Public, and all comments are included in the consultation feedback prior to the dates being finalised. The final decision is made under the delegated authority of the Cabinet Member for Children's Services, in consultation with the Teachers' Joint Consultative Committee.

Each school has a statutory responsibility to operate 380 sessions - the equivalent of 190 days - direct teaching to children each year. Schools in Wiltshire have indicated a strong preference for 195 day calendar which permits 5 staff development days to be set within term time dates. The Headteacher and Governors of each individual school determine when these days are taken.
