1	I would like to have restrictions on the area proposed but not 24hours 52weeks per year. This proposal will penalise all of the residents because of the actions of parents bringing and taking their children to and from school. Why can't we have restrictions for school times 8am to 5pm Monday to Friday, or resident parking only. No waiting 24hrs a day would be very restrictive to us who didn't ask for the school to be increased in size by 50% and during the planning stage the chosen residents were told that the increase in size of the school would not increase the amount of traffic! I have spent many hours with other residents trying to get the school and parents of children to be responsible and caring to us. We know we need some sort of system to safeguard, residents, parents, children and to maintain safe access to the school for emergency services, but not at any cost. A more user friendly scheme must be found for us the residents who have to live here 365 days per year.	The comments made regarding the impact of the proposed restriction on residents, is noted. Taking these comments into account, it is proposed that an amended Traffic Regulation Order of 'No Waiting Mon-Fri 8am to 6pm' be made to allow parking to continue outside of these times.

3	As a resident of the area, I feel that this order will simply move the problem on to other side roads like Coniston Road and The Mount. The issue of parents driving their children to the school needs to be address by means of a School Transport Plan. Also, parents (and residents) use these roads (especially Fulford Road) as almost a race track speeding along Fulford Road without a care for pedestrians / children (animals) that maybe crossing the road. The current speed limit of 30mph on Fulford Road, The Mount, Coniston Road & Windermere Rd needs to be reduced to 20mph before a child is seriously hurt.	The school has a travel plan in place and additional measures are being taken forward to encourage a reduction in car use for school journeys. This includes the provision of a formal crossing facility on The Down, which is due to be installed in Autumn 2018. A request for a 20mph speed restriction on the roads mentioned can be made via the Area Board issues system. The issue form for such requests can be found on the Area Board section of the Wiltshire Council website.
4	With ref to the proposed I strongly object to the use of double yellow lines in said area of Windermere road. Whilst I accept there is a danger to school children and residents in the proposed area and there is a need to restrict traffic flow at school term times, the proposed plan do's not take into account use by residents at evenings and weekends outside of school hours, Please note that Myself and other elderly residents in this area require the need of care assistance And as such the proposed could restrict their services. However, I should like to register an objection to "No waiting at any time" because a traffic problem only exists at the beginning & end of the school day. Surely prohibiting parking during those periods would be adequate. Why prevent people parking in the middle of the day, in the evening, at the weekends & in the school holidays?</p> <p>Alternatively, a "Residents Only" parking zone could be established, with a permit that can be lent to visitors or tradespeople if not being used by the householder. I write, not as a resident of Windermere Road, but as someone who frequently visits to assist my disabled 91 year old mother at number 6.
