Project Description:

The school hall is used frequently for community events such as the Village Fete, St Barts Benefice Holiday Club events and meetings organised by the Church Parish meetings and local childrens non-school activity clubs. We wish to provide adequate toilet facilities for community use adjacent to the school hall. We have successfully sought part-funding from the Schools Condition Allocation Grant SCA but we need to secure additional funding for this project to go ahead.
