



## Community Area Grants - Where to get local funding, help and advice (Section 2)

One of the community area grant criteria requires that you have sought funding from sources other than the area boards where you request over £1,000.

The following organisations can provide a range of services to voluntary organisations and community groups, including advice, information and training that can assist with issues such as starting up a group/project, organisational development, recruiting volunteers and funding.

We **strongly** advise you to investigate additional sources of funding. All of the organisations listed below will help **any** voluntary/community group.

### **Charities Information Bureau South & West (CIB)**

CIB helps voluntary and community groups across Wiltshire to raise money from local and national sources. They offer free advice on planning your fundraising, identifying where to find funds, and how to make effective applications.

You can discuss your funding requirements with an adviser by phone, email or in person at the CIB office in Devizes. Dedicated funding surgeries are held across Wiltshire including in Chippenham, Trowbridge, Pewsey and Salisbury, where you can book an hour's appointment to speak with a funding advisor. To discuss your project by phone or to arrange a meeting please call 01380 729279.

### **Wiltshire Council Central Bidding Unit**

The Wiltshire Council Central Bidding Unit (CBU) comprises three specialist posts that support funding and fundraising. The team provide expert advice on funding to voluntary (not for profit) organisations and charities, particularly for complex projects or those that require substantial funding throughout Wiltshire. CBU also supports statutory organisations (e.g. council, parish councils and schools and provide bidding advice to Wiltshire-based groups. To support these actions, the unit

provides information on where funding is available; for example, government, local government, foundations, trusts and charities.

In addition, the CBU produces a well-respected Regional Funding Bulletin (bi-monthly) which has the support of Funding SW and other funding bodies and is available free to any voluntary or statutory group across Wiltshire and Swindon. A separate schools funding bulletin (monthly) is produced specifically for school community groups across Wiltshire; this also distributes current and relevant funding information but is available only to school heads and external school co-ordinators. Please also note that the CBU works closely with the Charities Information Bureau and does not duplicate any work done by the CIB.

The Community Transport Small Grants Fund is for new or improved community transport initiatives and other measures which have a lasting effect on improving access to services and facilities in Wiltshire and Swindon. Grants of up to £1,000 are available through the Fund.

- **Landfill Community Fund**

The Landfill Communities Fund supports community, built heritage and environmental projects in the vicinity of landfill sites and / or landfill operator depots. The majority of Wiltshire & Swindon is covered by eligible catchments areas. Most applications range from £3,000 to £20,000. Your project will need to find 12.4% of the total grant applied for from a Third Party (a source other than LCF or the applicant)

- **Solve community fund**

A voluntary organisation or a community group with a project that shows clear community, social or environmental benefit can apply for a maximum of £500. This must be solely for the benefit of residents of Wiltshire.

- **Plain Action**

Plain Action is a rural development programme operated by a local action group over the Salisbury Plain area. It can provide capital and revenue grants to organisations which will help deliver its objectives in the fields of skills and training, employment and business, and community strengthening. It has underlying themes around military civilian integration and sustainability. It is funded primarily by the EU and Defra under the Rural Development Programme England 2007-13 and in part by Wiltshire Council.

Grants under the main programme are from £10,000 upwards, with up to 75% grant rate. Voluntary groups, parish councils and start-up and small businesses can all apply. A small grants scheme for amounts sub £10,000 is under development.
