SCHOOL TERMS AND HOLIDAYS 2012/13

Purpose

1. The purpose of this item is:
 - i) to report the findings of the consultation regarding proposed school term and holiday dates for 2012/13.
 - ii) to confirm JCC's support for the recommended school term and holiday dates for Wiltshire's Community, Voluntary Controlled and Community Special Schools for the school year 2012/13.

School Term & Holiday Dates – 2012/13

2. In line with the recommendation of the County Secretaries at its meeting in November 2010 a variety of interested parties including schools, neighbouring authorities, diocese plus others have been consulted on proposed term dates for 2012/13 (Appendix 1).
3. Appendix 2 details comments received as a result of this consultation.
4. A number of our neighbouring authorities have now either completed or are in the process of consulting on their own school term dates for 2012/13. The majority of our neighbours to the south west have consulted on dates similar, if not identical, to Wiltshire's proposal.

Proposal

5. JCC is invited to consider the responses to the consultation on the proposed school term & holiday dates for 2012/13 and decide whether to confirm its support for the dates detailed in Option 2.

Mrs C Walker	<p><i>I would express a preference for Option 1 for several reasons.</i></p> <p>1 I feel that a longer break during the summer is far more beneficial to the children than a couple of extra days during October half term. During the summer daylight is optimal and important for children's health and growth and so having the extra days in the summers means they can get maximum benefit from being outside during the longer summer days.</p> <p>2 I feel after working hard during the school year both teachers and children benefit from a longer summer holiday to recharge, five weeks isn't enough. This recharge will benefit their immune systems ready for the autumn and winter terms when children are more prone to illness.</p> <p>3 A longer break enables children to have 'down time' as well as 'active time' which I personally feel they don't have enough of in current times. I feel strongly that children benefit from time when they are free to do as they please and see where their imagination takes them. There doesn't always seem to be time during the school week for children to just 'play'. It takes a while for the children to unwind into the holiday and relax and adapt to a different schedule then they need time at the other end to gear up again into a 'school work' frame of mind. I feel a longer summer holiday gives them space to do this.</p> <p>4 A longer break gives working parents more time to plan time off to spend with their children. My husband's company often have an August meeting which cuts right into the holiday, a longer break would give him a greater chance of being able to take time off to be with our children - this is obviously a purely selfish reason but may apply to other parents!</p>	1
