What is happening?

- The council is changing the way it collects materials for recycling in 2020
- · Some recycling collection days will change
- Residents will receive further information about the changes through the post.
- · You will be able to view your new collection days online.
- You can print a collection calendar from the council's website.

The changes will ensure it is even easier to sort your recycling at home

- <u>Blue lidded bin</u> currently takes plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays, cardboard boxes, food cartons and drink cartons.
- <u>Blue lidded bin</u> will change to take all the above plus paper, food cans, drink cans, aerosols and foil.
- Please wash and squash your bottles, cartons and cans where possible and flatten cardboard boxes
- · If your cartons and bottles have lids, put them back on.
- Plastic film, black plastic and flower pots are not collected from the blue lidded bin



The following additional materials should be put in your blue lidded bin once you have been notified of your day change









What else can you recycle?

You will continue to use your **black box** for glass and textiles



- Clean and dry textiles must be bagged and tied
- No duvets, sleeping bags or unpaired shoes



Why are we making changes?

- · Easier for residents to use the kerbside recycling collection service.
- Easier for residents to separate their recyclable materials at home.
- Reduce the number of vehicles we use
- · Fewer vehicles means a reduction in our impact on the environment
- · A new materials recovery facility is being built which will sort the mixed recycling,

End Destination Charter

- Voluntary scheme developed by the Resource Association to promote openness and transparency over end destinations of waste.
- Provides clarity as to where materials collected for recycling are sent for reprocessing.
- Wiltshire Council is a signatory to the End Destination Charter and publishes an annual return on its website: http://www.wiltshire.gov.uk/what-happens-to-recycling
- In 2018/19, 89% of all of the waste collected for recycling, composting and re-use was managed within the UK
