Many residents have complained to the Parish Council about litter, litter bins overflowing, dog fouling and verges looking untidy. There is a sense of pride in the village and many residents want to help the village look its best again which this project aims to do. The Scout Group will coordinate residents and village groups/societies to work together on this project. This should raise a collective sense of pride in the village and reinforces the message that we are all responsible for looking after our corner of the world. Great Bedwyn Scout Group is a thriving group with nearly 70 children involved in the Beavers, Cubs or Scouts. The Scouts will focus their tidying efforts on a disussed allotment which will give these children space for learning gardening and outdoor/camping skills. This project aims to transform this currently unsafe space into a workable one which will benefit many children/young people. Scout group members will be able to achieve their Environment Partnership award through working in their local community in this way.

The project is registered with The Big Tidy up national campaign - and certain resources are available from here - posters, stickers, bin bags. To try and encourage as many people along as possible we need to be able to provide simple refreshments and provide tools for the job - strong gloves to protect childrens hands, litter pickers, dog-poop scoops. We also need a large skip for the morning to dispose of all the litter/waste collected. As many groups as possible will be asked to send volunteers in order to clean up as many parts of the village as possible. As well as the Scout Group, these include, WI, PCC, Tennis Club, Playgroup, school, Train passenger Group, residents groups, cricket club, Youth Group, canal boat owners. Not only will the Scout Group benefit by clearing an allotment for their use, but the Big Tidy up will prepare the village for the annual Open Gardens day and for the Best Kept Village Competition.
