Project Description:

Hft Wiltshire is a registered charity that provides supported living and residential accommodation for 45 adults with learning disabilities and autism including 40 people who live at Hft Rowde. The centre also provides meaningful day opportunities for a further 30 adults with learning disabilities including the Grow and Sow project.

Grow and Sow was established in 2016 and aside from the lead facilitator, the entire project is run by adults with learning disabilities and community volunteers.

Based across nearly 4 acres, the project includes a series of raised beds that are wheelchair accessible for growing plants and vegetables, a polytunnel, an orchard, a sensory trail with aromatic features, a sound garden and even a beehive. Grow and Sow offers people with learning disabilities and autism the opportunity, choice and support to design, create and maintain this special community garden. They undertake Green Exercise, enjoy relaxing sensory stimulation and connect with others from the local community. They plant cultivate harvest cook - and eat fruit and vegetables a rewarding process that develops skills and supports learning as part of Hft's focus on health living.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

This application will add to the Grow and Sow project already underway at Hft. It will add new polytunnels, bring a greenhouse into use and provide shelter for livestock. As well as benefiting the residents, the Grow and Sow project involves many local volunteers to help run the project, including Community Payback, local schools, Wiltshire Wildlife Milestones and Adult Wellbeing Projects. This breaks down barriers in the local community and helps to reduce social isolation for all involved.

The site will be the home to Wiltshire FA and over 50 affiliated youth football teams. The natural turf pitches need some new goalposts and to be marked out. This site will be home to a number of different sports groups from the local area.

Wiltshire FA has made a considerable investment to bring this facility to the centre of the county, in Devizes. Work to the football facilities is nearly complete and the pitches now need new goalposts.

The new facilities at Green Lane are a real benefit to Devizes bringing first class, modern facilities to the town. Project Description:

This scheme is to improve access through Bishop Canning’s churchyard enhancing a poorly surfaced and damaged footpath with a paved route more in keeping with the setting. The Conservation Area Statement recognises the churchyard as a critical component within the local built environment. As well as providing access to the Grade I listed church, the pathway provides public access to the burial ground, a route for the primary school’s walking bus and access to services within the village. The aim is to improve the public space make this part of the Conservation Area more attractive to residents and visitors additionally improving connectivity within the settlement. The church building is now the largest public space in the parish and is the venue for regular community events and participation in arts and culture. Suitable pedestrian access to the building is essential to enable it to function and in particular to accommodate less mobile and disabled parishioners

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

From the application, it is clear this path through the churchyard forms an important link in the village, for children going to school, people accessing the separate “halves” of the village and to get to community events taking place within the church.

The new equipment will include a sandpit, planters, seating, a stage and shelter. These works will improve the area, making it into a safe and stimulating learning environment for the children.

Input from Community Engagement Manager:

Little Bears is run by a charity committee and is not-for-profit, this makes it eligible for funding. The pre-school is co-located with Nursted School and many of the children feed into the primary school, so there is a strong link between the two creating a smooth transition for the children. These improvement to the outside learning space will benefit the pre-school’s children by creating an attractive and stimulated environment in which to learn and play.

<p>Project Description: Devizes Town FC is a community club providing Men's and Youth football within the town from their ground off Nursteed Road. There are currently two senior teams and the club is looking to set up a new Under 18s team to help transition players into adult football. The current floodlights are no longer fit for purpose. The league which the club plays in requires clubs to have working floodlights to allow mid-week and evening matches to go ahead. The league has been understanding in the previous season about Devizes Town's lack of floodlights but now requires the club to have them for the future season. Even though Wiltshire FA is investing in football facilities at Green Lane, Devizes, the club cannot play matches there and will continue to play at the Nursteed Road ground.</p> <p>Input from Community Engagement Manager: Devizes Town FC is important for the grassroots development of football within the town. There are a number of youth teams of different ages which feed up into the senior teams. The league requires clubs to have floodlights and have so far been understanding about Devizes' lack of them and has re-arranged fixtures. We would like to apply for funds via an area grant for Charlton cricket club nr Malmesbury. The club has been established since the late 50s originally formed with workers from Charlton park estate. Today we play in the Division 2 of the Cirencester District cricket league and act a feeder club and 3rd team for Malmesbury CC often giving under 14s an opportunity to play adult cricket last season this included two female Malmesbury under 15s who also play for the district. We also host Malmesbury CC under 11 games which is quite a sight on a Sunday morning One of the most critical pieces of equipment for a cricket club is a roller our current one was built in the early 70s and is just about on its last legs. A roller is used during March April and May to prepare the square with over 40 hours of pre-season rolling. During the season it is used every week to prepare pitches and has enabled Charlton to have one of the best pitches in the league. We have managed to secure funds of 3500.00 for the purchase of a reconditioned one but typically prices range from 4500.00 to 7000.00 We have however managed to source one that is immediately available from a well known cricket roller company called Powerroll for 4500.00 This is a one off machine and represents very good value. We would be grateful for any level of grant and support but are asking for 1000.00
