### Project Description:

Downton Football Club is renovating and re-opening a Social Club building and adjoining function room that closed in 2020 due to COVID.

Our aim is to re-open the venue as a social and wellbeing centre for the local community with any proceeds going to support Downton Football Clubs youth football.

We have fundraised circa 17000 inc 6000 Sport England match-fund grant, but need to raise 3000 more in next 9 days to secure Sport England funding and 8000 more in total. More information can be found at

# Input from Community Engagement Manager:

The social club is a well used community asset, and will be used as a vaccination centre for the pandemic response.

The football club now has ten children teams from under 5 through to under 18 girls providing sport coaching teamwork skills. The Clubhouse will provide a base for all teams' undercover facilities for group sessions in bad weather. The now defunct social club provided a social base for many people especially lower socioeconomic groups in Downton which the club will restore, including a Bingo Club a bridge club pool and darts teams. The club is also in advanced communication with Downton GP Practice to allow usage for loneliness and wellbeing groups to support their social prescribing and COVID response.

The application meets the grant criteria.
