Project Description: This grant will purchase refurbished digital devices to go into the homes of disadvantaged primary aged children. Many do not have the necessary technology that allows access to wellbeing and health support alongside promoting engagement with activities and learning that supports the life chances and aspirations of all ages. The digital poverty divide has been manifestly highlighted due to Covid 19. We will install software and filters ensure devices monitor use and support with internet safety. Devices will be issued within a loan agreement with usage alongside need reviewed regularly. Post Pandemic we will continue to allocate these devices to children and families in need.
