# Key Updates





Number of crimes recorded in Pewsey from February 2020 to February 2021








#### Number of thefts in Pewsey from February 2020 to February 2021




#### Number of burglaries in Pewsey from February 2020 to February 2021






There have been no reported burglaries thus far in February.


Number of Arson and criminal damages in Pewsey from March 2019 to February 2021

# Priorities – Some of what are we doing to keep you safe?

PRIORITY	UPDATE	
COVID-19 Patrols	Lockdown 3.0 All non-essential shops/businesses have closed except for click & collect and deliveries. Restaurants and Pubs have closed except for click & collect and deliveries. Schools have closed with the exception to key worker children and nurseries. You may meet ONE other person ONLY IN AN OUTDOOR SETTING. Support bubbles are permitted. Do not travel out of your local area.	
Rural	Burglaries have declined in the last few weeks with officers patrolling more rurally on a regular basis. Please continue to lock doors on vehicles, outbuildings and homes. Take serial numbers of tools, bikes, other vehicles etc and always secure all goods when not in use. Install CCTV/Security lighting if deemed necessary – this does act as a brilliant deterrent and is useful for police investigation if any incidences were to unfortunately occur.	
February	We have received a few reports relating to door-to-door salesmen or "Nottingham Knockers". If they are sighted then please report this to 101 with description of persons, what they are selling, any vehicle details (registration, make, model), direction of travel.	
March	Lockdown to ease: 8th March – Schools set to return, with outdoor afterschool sports allowed. 29th March – The 'rule of six' returns. 2 households. 6 persons. Can meet OUTDOORS. Can have coffee/picnics. Outdoor activities can return, such as tennis, golf etc.
