At this stage of the legal process, we cannot increase the hours/days of the proposed restriction without re- advertising the proposals, at further expense and would further delay the implementation of the other restrictions in the areas and whilst this may seem a request for a small addition, it will require an amendment to the whole Traffic Order. The hours agreed with the residents during the pre- consultation stage will allow permit holders to be parked all day preventing any non- residents parking outside of the restricted hours. We will monitor the effect of these restrictions and amend the hours/days of operation if justified.

CR1	Objects and wishes for more clarity of the proposals Long standing residents of 30 plus years have never not been able to park close to their home and are worried that the proposals would mean they are no longer able to do so. As they are elderly, this causes them considerable concern if they have to park some distance away from their home. They also asked why they were not consulted directly.	1	In considering the comments raised concerning limiting parking for residents of Colston Road and further investigation by engineers, it is recommended that this proposal be withdrawn. Proposals at the junction with Avon Terrace should continue in the interests of highway safety. A revised drawing can be found in Appendix 3 . Wiltshire Council does ensure that all processes regarding Traffic Regulation Orders are carried out following the statutory regulations as set out in legislation under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Whilst we do not have a statutory obligation to post notice on site, we do this as standard practice as we recognise that not everyone reads the local newspaper and it has proven to be very effective in reaching as wide an audience as possible.
CR2	Objects to the proposals These proposals will mean I will no longer as a resident be able to park outside my own property. I hope there's an understanding that by doing this around 30 residents with cars that live on Colston road will then start moving to park on adjacent roads. The proposal will cause more harm than good, yes you cut off the rat run road from Avon terrace through Dyehouse lane onto couch lane and into Commercial road. Which I completely agreed was right to do, but then to affect all residents on the above roads is not acceptable.	1	See comment CR1 above regarding the extent of the proposals. Wiltshire Council has no duty to provide parking for individuals; its statutory duty is to maintain the right of passage along the highway. It is the responsibility of the owner/keeper of the vehicle to find somewhere safe to park the vehicle and it is something for which the Council cannot take responsibility.
