As my husband is blind and we walk everywhere, we very much welcome the proposed changes. The present path by the Alms Houses is narrow and is impossible to walk side by side safely, as we have to do. This is even more difficult when the rubbish bins are there waiting for collection. We have to walk in single file which is tricky for a blind person. If someone is approaching from the other direction, there is no other option but for someone to step into the road, or obviously wait for us to walk through. It is impossible for anyone with a child in a push chair coming towards us to pass two people like ourselves who have to walk side by side. These improvements will help with this for other people using mobility aids, I think it is underestimated how many people have these issues so the pavement improvements with help enormously	The comments of support for are noted.

I think it is a waste of money. I don't think it will encourage more people to walk or ride bikes.	Whilst an additional benefit of the improvement scheme will be to encourage more walking to and from the town centre, the improvements will predominantly cater for the high numbers of pedestrians already using this route.
The money would be better spent on bringing some more shops into the town centre so that pedestrians would have some reason to visit it. The town centre is looking so run down and derelict that there is no need for road improvements as there is precious little to come into town for.
