- Revised AQ management report for Cabinet
- DEFRA bid submitted for car club electric vehicles, bike hire scheme, bike hangers, plus a bus marketing campaign

- Real time data is available on the AQE website; <u>Wiltshire Council Air Quality monitoring service (airqualityengland.co.uk)</u>
