#### **Project Summary:**

Calne Town Football Club Ltd was established in 1886. It is a thriving Football Club situated next to the Bremhill Social Club. Calne Town Council are the landowner and leases the buildings and the grounds to Calne Football Town Club Ltd on a nine-year lease. The council has agreed to extend the lease until 2041 - expected completion by early Feb '23. The existing 1980's clubhouse was erected in 2015, donated by the previous Chairperson. What was an old site office building, the clubhouse have become an unsafe, unrepairable, and Health and Safety risk. It is single skin with no insulation and with no accessibility access. Calne Town Football Club Ltd are committed to the improve the facilities at Bremhill with the delivery of the clubs'10years Development Plan. The club have replaced the pitch floodlights for the main and training pitch. The pitch permitter fencing. A new roof to the changing rooms and hot water boilers. The removal of asbestos to the back of the stadium. Annually, Calne Town Football Club Ltd organised the Party on the Pitch as well as hosting the presentation event for FC Calne. A well organised Community Event for the town to enjoy with live music creating a family atmosphere. Calne Town Football Club Ltd are seeking approval to extend the boundary to enable the new club house to build and and facilitate the provision of toilets for the North End Play area. Subject to approval from Planning. This would include the new welfare facilities. Calne Town Football Club Ltd have employed an architect who has surveyed the site and has drawn up plans.

### **Project Summary:**

The Marden House Centre is an historic building which was renovated in the early 90's as part of the 'Calne Project' which aimed to regenerate the town following the closure of its major employer. Structural surveys have been undertaken that have identified the need for structural repairs to the main hall masonry and roof beams as well as structural connections to tie together the outer walls on the east end of the building. Planning permission has been granted and Environment Agency approval obtained. Work is expected to start in July 2023.

### **Project Summary:**

### **Project Summary:**

The Open Blue will visit Calne Town Centre weekly for at least one hour on a Friday evening providing a place for the young people of Calne to meet up, hang out and have fun. We will provide board games, electronic games and table football as well as toasties, hot chocolate, biscuits and squash. All activities will be free at the point of delivery.

## 1. Background

Three funding streams are available to the Area Board, each with an annually awarded amount. These funding streams are as follows:

- Community Area Grants (capital)
- Young People (revenue)
- Health and Wellbeing (revenue)

The Area Board will be advised of the funding available prior to their first meeting of each financial year.

- 2.1. Councillors need to be satisfied that the applications meet the requirements as set out in the Area Board Funding and Grants Criteria and that the health and wellbeing and young person's funding guidelines have been adhered to.
- 2.2. Councillors must ensure that the distribution of funding is in accordance with the Scheme of Delegation to Area Boards.
- 2.3. Councillors need to consider any recommendations made by sub-groups of the Area Boards.

## 3. Environmental & Community Implications

Grant funding will contribute to the continuance and/or improvement of cultural, social and community activity and wellbeing in the community area, the extent of which will be dependent upon the individual project.
