Man down is a new mental health men's support group in Trowbridge. Men have a a higher rate of suicide and are more reluctant to seek support when they have a down turn in their mental health. A local resident who had struggled with his mental health felt there was nothing locally to support him. When he felt able to he got in contact with man down a Cornish organisation who run around 20 groups in Cornwall and Devon. They have support him with venue and flyer costs. The first session had 5 local men, the up coming one already has another 5 signed up.. Open minds - a local Trowbridge organisation who provide first aid mental health training - have said they can provide a place on their course for the leader of the group. This will help him signpost other members more effectively to extra support if needed and give him extra skills to have the more difficult conversation and further protect his mental health.

Project Summary:

Care and Share Trowbridge is a Peer Support Group for unpaid carers who care for people who experience Mental Health unwellness and challenges. The group meets monthly to provide peer support for unpaid carers through listening and sharing stories with each other over a cup of tea. Practical information, advice and resources are shared. The Peer Support Group is organised by Carer Support Wiltshire in partnership with Avon and Wiltshire Mental Health Partnership (AWP). Carer Support Wiltshire arrange the monthly meeting venue and light refreshments for carers attending as well as recruit, train and manage two volunteers to assist at each session. Carer Support Wiltshire check in with attendees and volunteers each month. Carer Support Wiltshire also promote the event and source any funding required to support the monthly group meeting. AWP provide a dedicated staff member to lead each monthly session. This staff member may also invite specialist clinicians from AWP to attend the Peer Support Group to provide additional support, information and resources for attendees, depending on what needs emerge at each session. This is a pilot café, and has proven successful in the first six months, with 8 regular attendees. Due to the success of this cafe, Carer Support Wiltshire will seek to open another one down in south/west Wiltshire area towards the middle of 2024.

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Project Summary:

'Keep Music in Mind' takes live acoustic music and song sessions of 45 minutes to older people (especially those living with dementia). This can be in care homes or at dementia specific day clubs, and some day clubs for older people some of whom may have early symptons. There are additional important benefits for carers. Music has medically proven well-being and health benefits for everyone, especially older people and those living with this dementia, a disease which sees a person slowly change and fade away. Our performances, delivered by experienced professional musicians, also really help carers (often older people themselves or working age family members) partly as if they get a much needed recharge if the session is at a day care club which looks after the person with dementia for a couple of hours, and also as they hear of/see the person they are slowly losing 'come back' for a short time when hearing the music and singing much loved songs. This provides a huge wellness boost and decreases feelings of isolation for carers in our community who carry out this invaluable and often thankless role. It also boosts resilience helping them to care for the person living with dementia in their own home. We developed this program in 2020 in conjunction with Alzheimer's Support Wiltshire, and it has been hugely successful. Keep Music In Mind is delivered to care homes and memory cafe's and day clubs in Wiltshire. The majority are dementia specialists but some benefit day clubs for older people many of whom are older and isolated. The application below will detail potential organisations which will benefit from this bid.

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Project Summary:

I work as a Group Coordinator for the Wiltshire Access Community Mental Health Service (Rethink Mental Illness). We have found a number of individuals in the local community want to improve their health, fitness and wellbeing but have found various barriers in doing so (for example, cost, confidence, anxiety). As a service, we want to help individuals to improve their physical fitness, wellbeing and improve their connection with the local community by running a free, dance fitness class in Trowbridge. Wiltshire Swindon and Sport have also agreed to help fund the project, by providing funds for the venue and music licence. We are asking for £500 pounds towards the costs of the venue which will be £24 per week for 2 hours - which will include a fitness session and social activity.

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Project Summary:

We have a dedicated youth space in the centre of Trowbridge where we are currently running regular youth sessions, providing activities in alignment with the National Youth Work Curriculum set out by the National Youth Agency. One of the key themes is based around healthy and safe relationships. The National Youth Agency highlights the need for relationship and sex education to be delivered by youth organisations as it can help young people understand what safe and healthy sexual relationships are. This is a topic we plan to cover regularly within our senior youth sessions. We plan to deliver at least 10 workshops that can be further replicated across all our groups.

Background
