Project Summary:

We run a monthly Repair Cafe at Wallington Hall on the 3rd Saturday of the month. Our team of volunteers work with local residents to repair their items to give them a longer lease of life, to save them money and to reduce the amount of landfill created in the town. We manage to repair on average 75% of the items we see. We also try to involve the owner in the repair in an attempt to educate them and to inspire them to repair more of their belongings in the future. With electrical items we always PAT test them before allowing residents to take them home and use them. We would really benefit from a new PAT testing machine to use during the cafe sessions. This would give us additional capacity when it is busy. The model our repairers prefer is the Seaward Primetest 100 PAT Tester, which is easy to use and reliable. Project Summary:

The rear of the club was derelict and in need of demolishing and total rebuilding. It was structurally unsound and unusable and it was essential work to ensure the longevity of the club building. When the derelict buildings were demolished it was established that the rear wall of the main hall building was also unsound and in bad repair. Additional funding was required (provided by club funds) to renovate. Therefore, the insulation and interior walls was no financially possible. We are now looking to complete with the assistance of a grant. This will enable the rear new extension to be used more; to retain heat; be comfortable and be used by smaller members groups within our community.

Project Summary:

We as a charity run a Pay it Forward scheme for Boaters in and around Bradford on Avon on the Kennet and Avon canal. People are able to donate into the scheme and/or nominate neighbours who may be in need. We then distribute eco-friendly smoke free fuel to Boaters through merchants on the canal to keep those most in need warm during winter. The need for fuel always by far surpasses the donations we receive.

Background
