## Local Updates

Priority	Update
Retail Criminal Behaviour Orders	In the last eight months the Trowbridge Neighbourhood Policing Team have been successful in obtaining 7 Criminal Behaviour Orders targeting our most prolific offenders in relation to Retail Crime, with two more having been applied for and are due to be heard at court in the next 4 weeks.  The orders are specific to each offender and prohibit them from entering named stores, where they have been convicted of shoplifting offences in the last two years.  Offenders would breach the order by entering stores they are prohibited from doing so, regardless of whether they go on to commit further offences. The maximum sentence for breaching a Criminal Behaviour Order is up to 5 years imprisonment.
Closure Orders	The Trowbridge Neighbourhood Policing Team, in partnership with relevant Landlords have applied for and been granted Partial Closure Orders on two properties in the Trowbridge area.  A Partial Closure Order prevents any person, other than named residents, from entering an address during a three month period and can be used to assist in dealing with addresses where persistent antisocial behaviour is evidenced.  4 <sup>th</sup> December 2024 – An address in Park Road – since the Partial Closure Order has been in place, 6 persons have been arrested and charged for breaching the order.  6 <sup>th</sup> December 2024 – An address in Towpath Road

## Current Priorities

Priority	Update
Business and Retail Crime Reduction	To reduce business and retail related crime in Trowbridge town centre and surrounding commercial areas, creating a safer environment for local businesses, employees and customers.
1	Engage with residents, community leaders and local businesses in hotspot areas to gather information on ASB trends and gain community support for policing efforts.
