

Community Area Grants - Where to get local funding, help and advice (Section 2)

One of the community area grant criteria requires that you have sought funding from sources other than the area boards where you request over £1,000.

The following organisations can provide a range of services to voluntary organisations and community groups, including advice, information and training that can assist with issues such as starting up a group/project, organisational development, recruiting volunteers and funding.

We **strongly** advise you to investigate additional sources of funding. All of the organisations listed below will help **any** voluntary/community group.

Charities Information Bureau South & West (CIB)

CIB helps voluntary and community groups across Wiltshire to raise money from local and national sources. They offer free advice on planning your fundraising, identifying where to find funds, and how to make effective applications.

You can discuss your funding requirements with an adviser by phone, email or in person at the CIB office in Devizes. Our advisors also visit many towns across Wiltshire, to book an appointment to discuss your project, please call 01380 729279.

Wiltshire Council Funding & Performance Team

As part of Wiltshire Council's Economy & Enterprise service, the Funding and Performance team specialises in the provision of funding advice and support for complex projects and other regeneration initiatives which can significantly contribute to the growth and sustainability of Wiltshire's economy. The team provides bidding advice and project support services to a range of organisations across Wiltshire, supporting statutory (council, parish councils and schools), voluntary and commercial organisations. The team produces information about where funding is available through a portfolio of funding bulletins.

The highly-respected funding bulletins include the monthly SW Regional Funding Bulletin which remains free to voluntary or statutory groups across Wiltshire and Swindon. The monthly Schools funding bulletin is distributed to school heads, extended schools co-ordinators and PTA's. The team also produce bulletins for organisations looking to fund projects in Arts, Sports and Renewable energy/Green funding and Play. The team is about to launch a new Business bulletin to help businesses obtain funding as well as take up other opportunities. Corporate funding services and social enterprise development are also delivered by the team, alongside management of economic development and regeneration programmes run by the council.

Landfill Community Fund

The Landfill Communities Fund supports community, built heritage and environmental projects in the vicinity of landfill sites and / or landfill operator depots. The majority of Wiltshire & Swindon is covered by eligible catchments areas. Most applications range from £3,000 to

£20,000. Your project will need to find 12.4% of the total grant applied for from a Third Party (a source other than LCF or the applicant)

Solve community fund

A voluntary organisation or a community group with a project that shows clear community, social or environmental benefit can apply for a maximum of £500. This must be solely for the benefit of residents of Wiltshire.

Plain Action

Plain Action is a rural development programme operated by a local action group over the Salisbury Plain area. It can provide capital and revenue grants to organisations which will help deliver its objectives in the fields of skills and training, employment and business, and community strengthening. It has underlying themes around military civilian integration and sustainability. It is funded primarily by the EU and Defra under the Rural Development Programme England 2007-13 and in part by Wiltshire Council.

Grants under the main programme are from £10,000 upwards, with up to 75% grant rate. Voluntary groups, parish councils and start-up and small businesses can all apply. A small grants scheme for amounts sub £10,000 is under development.

Currently all the grant funds are committed but we are hoping that there may be some redistribution of nation al funds which may allow further grants. Any news of further funds will be announced on the Plan Action web site.

Community Foundation for Wiltshire & Swindon

We are dedicated to improving the lives of disadvantaged people in Wiltshire & Swindon. We are building a permanent endowment fund to support the voluntary sector in our county by working with donors who are interested in supporting their local community. We give grants to groups and individuals fitting our criteria, during 2010/11 we distributed over £660k in funding to the county.

Main Grants between £500-£3,000 per year for up to three years.

(In the current economic climate we are unable to commit to 3 year funding and only likely to fund year 1)

Groups can apply to Main Grants to support a wide variety of project, core and ongoing costs

<u>Small Grants</u> of up to £500 are available to small projects that have an annual income of no more than £10,000pa. This is a fast track programme and applications can be turned around within a month.

<u>Wiltshire Police Authority</u>, working with the Community Foundation for Wiltshire and Swindon, has established a fund to help local groups address crime and anti-social behaviour, and improve personal and community security. The fund arises from the proceeds of the disposal of unclaimed property, and is usually around £25,000 per annum.

<u>Mid Counties Co-operative Grants</u> are up to a maximum of £2,000 and groups are advised only to apply for the amount they need to purchase an item of equipment or to fund a project. The Fund is particularly keen to support projects which seek to bring communities together to tackle local issues improving trust and understanding, and welcomes projects which offer a new or innovative approach.

The Foundation also has grant programmes to support the educational costs of individual children and young people, and a Scholarship fund to support young people from Wiltshire/Swindon who are studying for, or planning to study for, a degree or doctorate

The Wiltshire Council Arts Project Grant Scheme

This scheme is open to all voluntary and community organisations (not individuals) wishing to provide arts projects in Wiltshire. Arts projects can cover a wide range of creative opportunities, including visual arts, crafts, media and digital forms, literature and performing arts. The scheme aims to support the vibrant Wiltshire arts sector. £20,000 is available in 2 rounds. The maximum amount that can be applied for per application is £4,000.

Application deadlines:

Round 1 is 30 April 2012. Approved projects should take place between July 2012 and June 2013. Round 2 is 30 September 2012. Approved projects should take place between November 2012 and October 2013.
