1. Details of Project

Name of Organisation: Lyneham Primary School

Please outline your project below:

Creation of a Jubilee Woodland Walk within the extensive school grounds that can be enjoyed by all the community and provide a lasting legacy of the Diamond Jubilee celebrations that will take place on the weekend of 2nd June 2012.

The pathway will comprise a meandering woodland pathway approx.. 150m long through the grounds, planted with small cospes of trees, with seating and sculptures, that can be enjoyed by all our community.

Soil removed to create the pathway will be used to create a landscaped, turfed 'mound' alongside the pathway to add more interest to the walkway.

2. Where is the project taking place?

Within the grounds of Lyneham Primary School which are shared with our local community.

3. When will the project take place?

Tree planting will take place during the Lyneham Diamond Jubilee celebrations over the weekend of 1-3 June 2012

This project will promote the strong and vibrant community spirit that is being developed in Lyneham by the efforts of the Parish Council, Learning Together and Community Led Planning projects. With the withdrawal of the RAF, our community is having to work together to ensure that our community develops a strong community spirit and actively works together to improve our local environment for all. We are organising a community Jubilee Fete on 2nd June and at this fete we will invite members of the community to plant the trees along the walk and add their own commemorative plaque if they wish. We will then encourage the community to help maintain the walk and enjoy using it and watching the trees flourish and grow. The project will help to reinvigorate our

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local economy which has been badly hit by the withdrawal of the RAF as we will use local tradesmen and suppliers.

We believe that this project also showcases what we are so good at in our area – with our rural Community all working together to create a resource that can be enjoyed by all and improve both our local and global environment by planting trees to offset carbon emissions.

5. What is the desired outcome/s of this project?

To create a lasting community facility that enhances our local environment and which can be enjoyed and used as a learning resource by all members of our community.
