Wiltshire Police are compared against a group of 8 most similar forces. Wiltshire Police have performed in line with peers and better than average for Victim Based Crime and Domestic Burglary in the previous 12 month period (January 2012 - December 2012).

\* Detections include both Sanction Detections and Local Resolution

Overall reports/incidents of crime remain similar to those of the previous year.

The good news is Burglary – to both houses and other buildings – remains lower than when compared to last year's figures.

The figures re violence whilst disappointing – show an increase of 79 reports  
- this reflects a predominance of private space incidents, including domestic arguments (where positive reporting is encouraged) and other neighbour disputes.

Whilst there are few reports of public/night time violence this is not a real issue for the town.

The Police continue to work with the other partner agencies within the town, the Town Council/CCTV, the door staff, Street Pastors and the licensees via PubWatch.
