## OBJECTION AND SUPPORT COMMENTS

## Objection comments:

A. Vehicular access to the scout hut is essential for loading and unloading. Planning has been approved for development of a new facility on the current site. There is concern that the crossing and the associated lighting pole will impose a severe restriction on access to the scout hut and will have a detrimental effect on the viability of the approved planning development.
B. Concern that pedestrians are not visible to southbound traffic when buses are at the stop.
C. Consider moving the crossing either 5 metres further west of the proposed, or opposite No. 37 High Street. The site is too far east for the benefit of people from Willis Way where an unofficial footpath opposite Nos. 37/37A High Street demonstrates how pedestrians walking to the shops further west need a crossing at this location rather than 50 metres further east.
D. The Scout Group has had uninterrupted access from their premises to Purton High Street across the whole width of their frontage since they acquired the site at least 50 years ago. The siting of the crossing infringes on the Group's current right of access on to the High Street.

## Support comments:

E. Strongly supports the application for a crossing as it is very close to the approach to the surgery and will allow safer access for patients, particularly those who are elderly or disabled.
F. Supported as long as a track does not form across the grass leading to the surgery.
