A resident of Timbrell Street is concerned that the amendment to the parking control would restrict his and his family's ability to park outside his property. He asks to what end? As things stand people park outside his house all day on the yellow lines they never see a parking warden in the street. Suggests that the Council should be thinking of ways to help residents of Timbrell Street with the parking problems not doing a quick fix and not really caring what council tax payers want. Also complains that no-one from the Council has ever called at my house to ask me how they can help and asking if I have any ideas to resolve the problem.	The proposals outside the resident's property were part of an admin change to the legal order, which will not affect the current parking situation outside his property. With regards to helping residents of Timbrell Street, these proposals were developed as a result from hearing from concerned residents who wrote into us and/or the Town Council. We received comments from the businesses requesting an area of short-term parking to help increase turnover of parking and also further up at the entrance to Arch Yard, proposed double yellow lines so that residents and others have a better view when exiting Arch Yard. Concerns about the lack of visible enforcement by Wiltshire Council Parking Officers for the existing restrictions in Timbrell Street, has been raised with the Parking Services Manager.

Comments of Support

Resident of Stancomb Avenue Welcomed the lines installed last year in the interest of easing traffic congestion. However, a short space remains immediately prior to their driveway and has on a regular basis encountered problems regarding access with cars frequently parked very close to, and often across their driveway. This has created aggravation when requesting that cars are moved and, on many occasions, their requests have been met with resistance and verbal abuse.
