## Warning over telesales campaign

The trading standards team at Wiltshire Council is putting out a warning regarding a telesales call campaign which is currently targeting Wiltshire homeowners. The caller offers domestic alarm systems which appear cheap, but then buyers are required to sign up to a monitoring service which can cost up to £6,000. It is also claimed the alarms are linked directly to the local police. These claims are untrue and calls should be reported to Consumer Direct on 08454 040506.

Anyone agreeing to buy anything from a trader who visits them at home must be provided with a written notice of the right to cancel within seven days; it is a criminal offence for them not to provide this.

## Funding for future Olympians and Paralympians



Supporting Wiltshire's talented sports people

No one can forget the sense of pride and celebration when Wiltshire's athletes won medals at last year's Olympic and Paralympic Games. Now in its fourth year, Wiltshire Council's Funding Future Olympians and Paralympians Grant is open for applications.

As part of building on the success of 2012, the council is working with local businesses to support rising sports stars by awarding grant funding. The funding will enable access to training and competitive opportunities as well as purchasing equipment and covering transport costs to regional and national events. The council allocates a total of £5,000 to support elite athletes, but hopes that by working in partnership with local businesses significantly more money can be raised.

Previous recipients of the grant include Olympian Francesca Fox and Paralympian Aaron Moores. Francesca competed at the London 2012 Olympics as part of the Team GB Rhythmic Gymnastics squad. Aaron competed at the London 2012 Paralympics in the S14 category and won a silver medal in the backstroke.

People of any age who are competing at a national level, or above, in any sport recognised by Sport England are invited to apply. The deadline for applications is 5pm on Monday, January 20 2014. For more information, the criteria and the [application form](#) visit the council's website.

## People in Wiltshire encouraged to consider adoption



Families who have adopted children from the county have been speaking about their own experiences to help Wiltshire Council's campaign to "help our children find a family."

Wiltshire Council wants to encourage more people to come forward, and to help dispel the myths that people may feel prevent them from adopting a child.

Since April this year, 27 children or young people have been adopted in Wiltshire and there are currently 16 more waiting for adoption. The council's "help our children find a family" campaign was launched in August this year helping to raise public awareness.

Many of the Wiltshire children in need of adoption have been unable to remain with their birth family because of neglect, abuse or because their parents have been unable to cope. They have often had difficult and sometimes traumatic starts to their young lives.

## Exhibition for army personnel relocating

---



Exhibitions are being held so local people can find out more about plans which will see Army personnel and their families relocating to Wiltshire.

In March 2013 it was announced that approximately 4,000 additional troops will be located in Wiltshire over the next five years as part of the Army's Basing Programme.

Wiltshire Council has been working closely with the Ministry of Defence's Defence Infrastructure Organisation (MOD DIO) and agencies from across the county to ensure key facilities and infrastructure will be in place for both the local community and incoming troops and their families.

The public is invited to find out more about this work at a series of exhibitions in South Wiltshire. The MOD and Wiltshire Council is welcoming local input at this early planning stage to ensure the additional troops and their families can integrate smoothly with existing communities. The exhibitions are intended to encourage widespread engagement and raise awareness of future plans prior to formal consultation through the planning approvals process, which is likely to take place in early 2014.

There will be an opportunity for people to make comments at the exhibitions as well as by e-mail or by sending their views by post.

The exhibitions will be open to the public at Wellington Academy, Tidworth from 7.30pm to 9pm on 27 November 2013 when there will be opportunities to speak to DIO staff who are delivering the work, representatives from the Army as well as Wiltshire Council's elected members and officers. From 28 November 2013 to 6 December 2013 there will be exhibitions at Amesbury Library, Durrington Library and Tidworth Leisure Centre.

# Land Drainage Byelaws

---

Flooding is considered to be a serious issue in Wiltshire, and the council has had to respond to a number of significant flooding events which have affected communities in recent years. The Flood and Water Management Act 2010 amended section 66 of the Land Drainage Act 1991 to allow local authorities to make land drainage byelaws. These byelaws also create criminal offences which can be prosecuted in the Magistrate's Courts. The council is now intending to use its powers to make byelaws to help it carry out its duties effectively and in doing so assist with reducing flood risk for local communities.

The Flood and Water Management Act 2010 allows local authorities to make byelaws for the following purposes:

- To secure the efficient working of a drainage system in its area;
- To regulate the effects of a drainage system on the environment;
- To secure the effectiveness of flood risk management work

The proposed byelaws for Wiltshire are based on the Defra set of model Land Drainage byelaws which are broadly similar to the byelaws which have been used for many years by the Environment Agency.

The first stage of this process is to forward the proposed draft byelaws to Defra which is followed by a formal consultation with Natural England and the Canal and River Trust (the local navigation authority in Wiltshire). Although not required to do so, the council has also chosen to informally consult with parish and town councils through the parish newsletter before the proposed byelaws are considered by the council. Subject to the outcome of the consultation with Natural England and the Canal and River Trust and having considered any responses received to the informal consultation, a decision on whether or not to make the byelaws will be taken by the council. Under the council's constitution a decision on the making of byelaws is reserved to Full Council. If the council so decides, the byelaws will be made and the formal (statutory) consultation will then be undertaken, before the byelaws (and any unresolved objections) are forwarded to the Secretary of state for confirmation. Please note that the byelaws cannot come into operation until they are confirmed by the Secretary of State.

## Wiltshire teenagers campaign against on line bullying

Wiltshire teenagers have masterminded a campaign which is launched this week to encourage young people to speak out against online bullying.

Eleven young people from across the county have produced a film and sent out posters with key information to schools challenging young people to recognise when people are being bullied online and how to do something about it.

Wiltshire Council has co-ordinated the campaign which was launched during national anti-bullying week from November 18 2013 with a special event at County Hall. Local schools, the police and other key agencies viewed the film the 13-17 year olds have made and saw how young people can stay safe while being online. The campaign will be using the twitter hashtag #breakthecycle. The teenagers are members of the Wiltshire Young Commissioners who help advise Wiltshire Council on issues affecting young people.
