Project description

The project is to provide additional play equipment which is primarily aimed at the 13-21 age groups. We will install two new activity walls at either end of the existing hard surface and mark out a basketball court. Additionally we will replace the worn-out surface beneath the play equipment which has been identified as high risk in the annual inspections and risk assessments and needs replacing.

ID 941	Devizes School	Disabled toilet facility	£4,904

Project description

To provide a disabled toilet facility adjacent to the Main Hall of the school. This is the primary location of many out-of-hours school and community events. The nearest other disabled facility is on the other side of the school quad which is some distance to travel, particularly at night. In addition the project will provide improved accessibility into the school grounds and around the school site for students and visitors who are wheelchair users. The work includes the installation of ramps, level transit and kerb alterations which will improve access to the whole campus area as well as to the school site.

Project description

Installation of a 10kw array on roof of village hall at approx. cost 12000.00 - 13000.00 The Social Centre belongs to the village parishioners and the Parish Council are the Trustees. Parishioners are given preferential rates for hiring's. The Village Hall is the focal point for many clubs and other organisations and is well used and valued by the village and its occupants.

Project description

The Caenhill Countryside Centre is a rural learning centre where farming links to education, rural skills and countryside life. We work with schools and children's groups to encourage learning outside the classroom. We support children through their schools and youth groups to encourage a learning pattern and personal development. Our curriculum supported programme works with teaching staff to encourage the student. We also support community groups with crafts projects and learning. A key area is with Help 4 Heroes personnel on rehabilitation following on from active service. A new direction in a peaceful environment to help with future choices.

Our project works in the rural communities which benefits many young people youth groups D of E students and communities. Youth leadership programmes educational foundation courses - for those struggling with their basic education. We are currently supporting soldiers from H4H with their rehabilitation programme to find new pathways in their lives following on from active service. The work we have begun so far has proved a strong local asset for those taking part. A dedicated area to improve the knowledge and skills base would be a valuable asset which would also link into the rural heritage of skills which are rarely heard about. The farm has a rundown stable which will be used as a ruralcraft area. Some building work is needed to make the roof watertight and safe and to replace doors and window frames. It will then be an invaluable resource where participants can take part in some of our traditional crafts - willow weaving thatching spinning and weaving and other countryside crafts. The stable once repaired will be available for the use of crafts and a wider learning experience on the farm. This will generate an income for the use of the premises link with local crafters and ensure a sustainable future for the repaired stable.

We hope to replace all the old panelling with routed MDF to match repairs carried out some time ago. Once the carpentry is complete and also improvements to heating and lighting the Hall require redecoration. The kitchen is also in poor condition and requires decoration
